

Left: David Baldacci with director Lauren McCauley at the Beachside Book Festival Right: The finalists in our mascot competition at Rehoboth Elementary School




FINANCIALS

SOURCES OF REVENUE

Our library's main sources of funding come from Sussex County, the State of Delaware, and the City of Rehoboth Beach.

During our last fiscal year, FY24, we had spent less money on collections and programs due to a shortage in staff who could order new materials and organize programs. As a result, we had leftover funds from the Friends of the Library and put in a smaller request than previous years.



Library funds are broken down into several subcategories, including: fines/fees, income from our used book sale, library store, and parking spaces, and grants.

In FY25, we earned:

\$20,205.69 in Fines & Fees \$15,417.59 in Donations \$9,706.00 in Grants \$4,258.00 in Book Sales \$4,200.00 in Parking Spaces \$434.00 in Library Store sales


FINANCIALS

EXPENSES

We returned to a full staff in June 2024, and as a result our personnel costs rose by almost \$80,000 compared to the previous fiscal year. This is also due to our efforts to raise all salaries by 3% each year to remain competitive with other employers and keep up with the rising cost of living.

Our maintenance costs also remain high due to the age of the building and the need to replace our HVAC system. We expect those numbers to decrease once renovations are underway.

As reflected in our budget, our Collections costs more than doubled compared to the previous fiscal year as our staff was able to return to regular monthly orders.


We added some new items to our collection this year. On Earth Day, we launched our new Seed Library! Patrons could check out up to four packets of seeds per day on select days of the week from April to August. By the end of the summer, we had distributed 650 packets! We look forward to continuing the program next spring.



In addition to the Seed Library, we ordered five new hotspots from T-Mobile to keep up with the high demand in the summer. We also introduced puzzles to our collection, which patrons can check out and try at home.



PROGRAMS



We offered over 600 programs for youth & adults with over 8,000 people in attendance throughout FY25.
